SERMON NOTES

Ephesians 4:28-32
“Hand, Mouth, and Heart”

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The following questions help us engage with the sermon, music, and liturgy in this morning's worship service, and may be useful during personal devotions, group studies, and family worship.

1. What is the thief to do with his own hands?
2. What are ways, beyond the obvious, that we may be acting as a thief?
3. What does the word “corrupting” mean in verse 4:29? Where do you see “corrupting talk” in your own life? Why do you think it is present in your life?
4. Where does “corrupting talk” come from? How should believers respond when hearing “corrupting talk?”
5. What type of speech should come from believers?
6. How is the Holy Spirit grieved? What does this say about the Holy Spirit? How should this motivate our sanctification?
7. What does it mean to be “sealed for the day of redemption?”
8. According to Ephesians 4:32 what should motivate our forgiveness of others? How does this empower us to live as becomes followers of Christ?
